5) Student Handbook Updates:

- Clarified percentages for letter grade calculations.
- Updated transfer acceptance policy for all accredited schools.

- Clarified dual credit registration procedures for those classes taught at the high school versus those directly from college.
- Clarified valedictorian and salutatorian award requirements.
- Requirements for communication devices in school--must be off and not visible.
- Activity insurance covers catastrophic events, but students can participate without any medical insurance of their own with a signed waiver.
- Updated athletic eligibility requirements to allow students who have failed their first grade check to continue practice and play for five days in order to improve academically. If there is not improvement after five day, student may practice but not play and if at the subsequent grade check they have not improved they would be removed from sport.

Topics from Principal

- 1) Staff in-service training today and tomorrow, October 8, is a staff off day.
- 2) Student Activities:
 - Jr High volleyball practice began September 29.

Topics from Principal

1) The committee visit for the Exemplary Program award will be on February 7. Mr. McFall shared information about the bio-fuels program that he and Mr. Braun have collaborated on. Currently Mr. Braun's ag classes are learning about diesel engines and how they differ from gas engines and the economic impact of using bio-fuel in machines. Mr. McFall's chemistry class is learning about the production aspect of bio-fuels and will incorporate hands-on laboratory work this spring. In the future Mr. McFall would like to expand the program by also growing their own canola or mustard for producing bio-fuels. He indicated that a press has been purchased already to learn how to extract the oils from the seed.

- The following additions have been made to the athletic code, both of which have for the most part been in practice but never documented:
 - Under **Parent/Student Responsibilities for Participation, Permission Form** added part e. All Injuries occurring while participating in athletics must be reported to the coach. Athletes who are treated by a physician and removed from participation must obtain written permission from the physician in order to return to the activity.
 - Under **Appearance** added part b. Hair style/color must not impede the performance, be deemed a safety hazard, or be distracting/stand out.
- There was further discussion regarding the academic requirements for athletic eligibility. Mr. Malm confirmed that academic ability is addressed for each student as well as their placement in appropriate classes and that there are mechanisms in place to support the academic needs of individual students.

Topics from Principal

1) Student Activities:

- ACT will be given at THS on February 12, 8am.
- BPA districts were held at UI January 21; 14 students placed within top three of their events and will be headed to state in Boise March 10-12.

5) Informational & Feedback Issues

- Brad shared the Pathway to Promotion agreement for junior high students who are in jeopardy of failing. The state now requires junior high students to pass a minimum of 80% of their credits and not fail one subject for the entire year. The agreement gives students (and parents) four options to remedy grade issues.

- In 2013-14, there will be a defined set of national core standards in math and English that will be integrated into the curriculum. Senior projects will be required for graduates starting with the class of 2013.
- Brad shared the Students Come First website: www.sde.idaho.gov/site/studentscomefirst and some basics of the legislation being presented by Superintendent Luna regarding education reform in Idaho. Some of the main topics are providing laptops to all students, requirement of taking online classes each year, patron input on staff evaluations, pay for performance model, contracts and tenure, and negotiations being held to salary and benefits only. - The question was asked if there was a process to review the athletic code; Brad indicated that first discussions would be with the Athletic Director and himself and final approval would be done by the school board.

Topics from Principal

1) Student Activities:

- BPA State Leadership Conference was held in Boise March 10-11. Two students, Marissa Fry and Melissa Mayo, qualified for nationals to be held May 3-7 in Washington, DC.
- Jacob Chambers was selected to the first team all state Knowledge Bowl for his performance at the state competition.
- State FFA competition being held April 5-8; 20 students attending.
- Report cards were distributed on April 5 and honor roll lunch will be held April 13.
- Eighth grade science fair will be held April 21, 3:30-5:30pm.
- April 24 is Enrichment Day and will feature motivational speaker Scott Backovich speaking about "Bold Choices".
- FFA Awards banquet will be held April 24, 6pm.
- ISAT testing will be done April 26-May 2.
- District II Band Festival will take place in Lewiston April 27.
- Prom will be held April 30 in Moscow at 1912 Building.

2) Students of the Month:

3) Staff:

- Mr. Braun received an honorable mention for the Governor's Industry Award for Notable Teaching in Science (GIANTS) and will be recognized by Governor Otter in Boise April 15.
- THS was awarded exemplary status for 2010-11 by Idaho State Accreditation Committee for the biofuels program; congratulations to Mr. McFall and Mr. Braun.

4) Informational & Feedback Issues

- Parent-teacher conference attendance percentages continue to grow, 38% in fall 2009 compared to 56% in fall 2010 and 39% in spring 2010 compared to 52% in spring 2011. Some of the growth is likely due to the seventh grade student-led conference format. Eighth grade will also follow this format next year.
- Supplemental levy election will be held May 17 with the polling done downtown. Karen Nelson is organizing a Community Awareness Team to make sure that accurate information is distributed to district patrons; volunteers are welcome and their next meeting is Tuesday, April 12 at 6:30pm at THS.
- Brad shared some basic information regarding the school reform legislation that was passed this year:
 - SB1108 regarding contracts and negotiations now defines two contract categories, A which is a one year contract for teachers with 1-3 years and B which is a contract for 2 years with rollover for teacher with 4+ years. Current tenured teachers are grandfathered in. The stipulation about negotiations indicates that only salary and benefits can be negotiated by teachers.
 - SB1184 regarding technology implementation designates that teachers will be provided mobile communication devices (i.e. laptops or current technology) beginning in 2012-13 and then in 2013-14 at least 1/3 of students will receive them, another 1/3 the following year, and the final 1/3 the subsequent year. The bill indicates replacement every four years to remain current. This legislation also designates stipulations for dual credit and online classes. High schools will have to accept credits from accredited institutions. The question was raised about the requirement for students to complete online classes and as found in the bill text there is no current requirement , but that it will likely be forthcoming for the class of 2016.
 - SB1110 regarding pay for performance reduces the salary reimbursement rate from the state. Teachers could be granted this type of pay for measurable student growth which may be difficult in some subjects as standard testing is given in only math, English, and language use (by ISAT). School districts may run levies to cover salary money.

- Request submitted to Nez Perce Local Education Fund for second portable computer lab.
- Coach Rob Bafus awarded 1A/2A/3A male coach of the year at North Idaho Sports Banquet April 9.

4) Informational & Feedback Issues

- Semester finals May 16-20 for seniors and May 24-27 for all others. Last day of school Friday, May 27 is an early release day.

- Idaho Education Network installed in Library along with more bandwidth for video conferencing. This will bring opportunities for distance learning for students as well as community use for workshops, etc. Wireless routers will also be supplied by the state.
- Clarifications about the technology mandated under education reform laws—the number of online classes required is yet to be determined; the intent of laptops is to allow classes to be taken outside of school hours; local board will set policy for laptop usage; attrition of teachers for online classes will be under local control.
- Supplemental levy community awareness group was clarified as a “yes vote” group rather than informational only. If levy passes, funding will be restored to 2 years ago meaning that teacher salaries will reinstate the 5% reduction taken last year and additional teacher workdays will be restored.
- 2011-12 school calendar is available on website; board will review for one correction at next meeting—January 2 is considered a national holiday so the return to school after winter break would change to January 3 if approved.
- Review of the cancellation of baseball this year: lack of players due to one quit, one dismissed of rule violation, and one injured. School checked into playing with less than nine and rules indicate game must be started and ended with nine but this option was determined to be a very bad practice. All players must have a minimum of 10 practices so joining late is not an option at this point in the season; each day can only have one counted practice and Sunday is not available. To play two sports (i.e. baseball and track) require agreement of both coaches which is unlikely.
