Committee Reports

1) PAC Information:

- It was shared with Christy Castro what the PAC committee is responsible for as outlined in the handout provided at the meeting.
- Moreesa Sandquist was welcomed as a new PAC committee member.

2) Student Handbook:

- The 2012-13 calendar was referred to on back page.
- The athletic schedules will be about the same as in the handbook with a few changes.
- The 2012-13 graduation requirement changes to the handbook are as follows:
 - Math and Science changed from 4 semester credits to 6 semester credits each.
 - Senior Project was added as 1 semester credit.
 - The Electives changed from 13 credits to 10 credits.
 - The total semester credits will now be 48 credits.
 - There were changes to the Alternate Route to Graduation which reflects provisions for students who have not passed one or more sections of the ISAT by the fall of their senior year. The student may appeal to the Troy School District Board of Trustees to be allowed the opportunity to demonstrate proficiency by utilizing the Idaho Plato Learning Network (IPLN). Using Plato students must demonstrate mastery in areas of deficiency identified by the ISAT-10 in order to graduate.
 - The State Board of Education tempo rule of change for math is as follows: students who have completed six (6) credits of math prior to the fall of their last year of high school, including at least two (2) semesters of an Advanced Placement or dual credit calculus or higher level course, are exempt from taking math during their last year of high school.
- Absences will be excused by a phone call or a written note from the parent/guardian.
- The no harassment policy added bullying.
- New meal prices were referred to.

5) Student Handbook Updates:

- Clarified percentages for letter grade calculations.

- Clarified valedictorian and salutatorian award requirements.
- Requirements for communication devices in school--must be off and not visible.
- Activity insurance covers catastrophic events, but students can participate without any medical insurance of their own with a signed waiver.
- Updated athletic eligibility requirements to allow students who have failed their first grade check to continue practice and play for five days in order to improve academically. If there is not improvement after five day, student may practice but not play and if at the subsequent grade check they have not improved they would be removed from sport.

 - 1A D2: Deary, Highland, Kendrick, Summit, Nezperce, and TimberlineKamiah has successfully petitioned to "play down" to 1A D1 from 2A; Genesee successfully petition to stay at 1A D1 although they would be classified as 1A D2 based on enrollment; Deary and Kendrick dropped into 1A D2 based on enrollment. The enrollment caps are 100-150 students in grade 9-12 for 1A D1 and less than 100 for 1A D2.
