## HEALTHY MEALS

Compared to lunches brought from home, school lunches provide more protein, fiber, vitamin A, and calcium. School lunches also have fewer calories, less saturated fat, and sugar. School lunch provides greater exposure to fruits and vegetables than packed lunches.<sup>2</sup>



The National School Lunch Program provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost, or free lunches to children each day. School lunches must meet Federal and State nutrition requirements.
