Dear Family,

The year ahead promises to be an exciting one—and a very important one for your child. This is the year your child will begin to learn to read. Learning to read is hard work, but it will be fun too, because your child will be using a highly motivating program called Superkids. But the learning doesn't take place just in the classroom. The Superkids program also includes a parent web portal, which contains information about what your child will learn during the year, tips for helping your child practice skills learned in class, and activities to do at home.

Superkids is a time-tested program that has taught thousands of children to read and write. It is based on solid scientific research and aligns to the Common Core State Standards, a set of national learning expectations that most states support. Not only is Superkids effective, it's a program that makes learning to read fun! Isn't that what all of us want for our own super kids?
