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## TES Principal Report September 2017

### **Students:**

*Back to School Night:* Troy Elementary hosted our annual *Back to School Night Dinner* sponsored by the TES Parent Group. Families were able to meet and greet the staff, as the staff served pulled pork dinners. There were approximately 200 meals served. I presented information about staff, procedures, goals, curriculum, Schoolwide Title, communications, and our breakfast/lunch programs. Families participated in a scavenger hunt of staff in order to meet the team of professionals their child interacts with each day.

*Classrooms:* Students started their year with an all-school assembly and gathered around the main flagpole outside for the Pledge of Allegiance. Students have been practicing their safety drills, procedures, learning new routines, and expectations. The math and ELA "reach" (reteach/enrich) has started.

*Band:* Students will begin band in grades 4-6 starting Sept. 19th.

*Assessments:* Students and staff have completed the first of the year assessments. The staff will analyze the data, and create our SMART goals September 14th. From this data, "reading plans" that tie into our Literacy Plan will be developed with parent input.

TES is a pilot school for the new Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI). *I-stations* is the name of the program used in this process. We are responsible for administering both the "old" IRI and the "new" IRI within a week of each other. Teachers have completed the webinars to get the process going.

*Supply Donations:* TES has been fortunate to receive a variety of donations of school supplies that include backpacks, rulers, notebooks, pencils, etc.

*Safety Drills:* Fire drill, crosswalk safety, AED, FERPA, and Homeless Students
