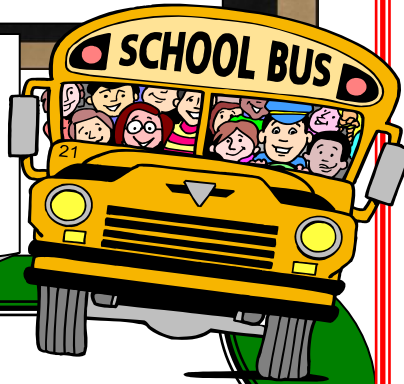

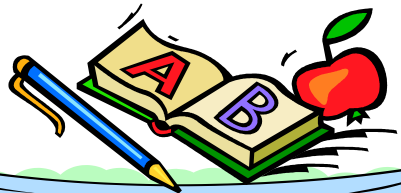
✓ - Conferences – Thank you parents for coming to last week's conferences. It was great to meet with all of you and share how great your child is progressing in second grade.



STANDARDS

Math – 2.M.MD.C.08 - The Highly Proficient student can count up to \$100.00 using a variety of coins and bills including word problems. Count money to \$100.00 and solve word problems involving dollar bills, quarters, dimes, nickels, and pennies, using \$ and ¢ symbols appropriately. Example: If you have 2 dimes and 3 pennies, how many cents do you have? (10 days)

Reading – 2.R.RL.04 - The Highly Proficient student can create his/her own poem and describes the rhythm and meaning within the writing. Describe how words and phrases (e.g., regular beats, alliteration, rhymes, repeated lines) supply rhythm and meaning in a story, poem, or song. (10 days)
